Some other highlights and events from the year:

Last March, after offering the house next to the library for relocation without any offers, we had it torn down. The lot has been graded and seeded and is available for us to use.





Courtyard Estates sponsored a *Wellness Clinic* offering free blood pressure checks and blood sugar screenings. We also held a *Diabetes Academy* class, presented by a diabetic educator which was well attended. I received very positive feedback on these community health-related events!

We had a *Learn to Crochet* class that went on once a week for most of last winter and spring. Library patron Barb Heggen taught the group how to crochet many different things. This week we are starting *Learn to Knit* with Amy Ingle instructing. We have 22 people signed up!

We held a *Christmas Craft Night* led by volunteer Joan Van Gorp. It was a fun night for all ages! I've had many that attended asked when we will be having it again.





We wrapped up the year helping at the Winterfest celebration sponsored by the Celebration Committee. We had a gingerbread house making activity and the Friends of the Library's annual tree and wreath auction. The auction raised \$355 for a new public catalog computer.









Today's library is obviously not all about books. We spend much of our time helping patrons use the computers, perform research, work on resumes, look for employment, fax, print and copy documents, proctor tests, and answer questions about our community. We have many people that come in and use our wireless internet access. Some of these are students that do not have internet at home. Some of these are unemployed people looking for jobs. Some of these are retired people just wanting to browse the internet. Whatever the reason, our library allows them free access.

In addition to my work at the library, I fill in at City Hall, handling all of the website changes and social media communications for both the library and the City and assist with grant writing for both the library and the City. I am also still on the board of the Jasper Library Association. In my role on that board, I have met with other library directors, the County Supervisors, and the County Auditor and his staff regarding the distribution and measurement of the funding received from Jasper County. I have also been assisting a library director from Warren County calculate a fair distribution of their funds that is modeled after the work I did for Jasper County. This year, we completely reformatted the presentation we gave to the Supervisors for our funding request. I published two separate flyers for the JLA to use in that request. One, a directory of libraries in the county, and the second, a flyer explaining what Jasper County libraries have to offer. They were very well received and our funding request was granted.

We received a grant from the State Library of Iowa to cover the cost of a library consultant to perform a needs assessment of the library. This will happen in March. This will provide us with a good tool to plan our future and to secure any grants may be available to us. I sent him all of the documentation he requested. He will be meeting with the board on March 3rd. I am looking forward to seeing what he has to say.
