CITY OF PRAIRIE CITY MINUTES OCTOBER 14, 2020

The City Council of Prairie City, Jasper County, Iowa, met on October 14, 2020, in regular session at the Prairie City Community Building and via ZOOM. At 6:08 p.m. Mayor Alleger called the meeting to order, and all joined in reciting The Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Alleger presented a certificate of completion from The Municipal Leadership Academy to Councilor Townsend.

Roll Call: Roll was called showing members present and absent as follows: Present: Mayor Alleger; Councilors: Townsend, Berger, Lindsay, McDonald and Taylor. Also in attendance: City Administrator, John Lloyd; City Clerk, Jodie Wyman; Library Director, Sue Ponder; Interim Police Chief, Mike German; City Water and Sewer Operator, Carl Van Der Kamp; and City Engineer, Andrew Inhelder.

The new Prairie City Monroe School Superintendent, Michelle Havenstrite, introduced herself to council before introducing the Prairie City Monroe School Resource Officer, Adam Choat. Together they shared a brief overview of the new grant funded community program.

<u>Public Comments:</u> Brad Magg, owner of Goldie's, from Prairie City requested council modify the current ordinance to allow semi/trailer parking on the north side of W. Second Street. Magg commented that before committing to a large investment for expanding the business he would like to know that customer parking will be available.

Ann McDonald addressed council about an anonymous letter that was mailed to her home regarding concern for storage units that should be paying LOST dollars. She will deliver a copy of this letter to Prairie City City Hall for further investigation into the LOST revenues. No action was taken.

Agenda Approval: It was moved by McDonald and seconded by Townsend to approve the agenda. The motion passed all ayes.

<u>Consent Agenda:</u> It was moved by Berger and seconded by Taylor to approve the consent agenda. The motion passed all ayes.

<u>Old Business:</u> It was moved by Taylor to approve Task Order #13 for Marshall Street reconstruction design bidding. The motion was seconded by McDonald. The motion was passed all ayes.

It was moved by McDonald and seconded by Berger to approve Resolution 10-14-20-2 approving a contract between Prairie City, Iowa, and J&K Contracting, LLC, for the Water Main & Sanitary Extension 2020. Resolution 10-14-20-2 passed all ayes.

It was moved to approve change order #1 for the Water & Sewer Extension in the amount of \$52,700 by McDonald. It was seconded by Taylor and passed all ayes.

It was moved by McDonald to approve Task Order #12 for staking, observation, contractor coordination, and construction related document review on the Water Main & Sanitary Sewer Extension 2020 Project. The motion was seconded by Lindsay. The motion was passed all ayes.

New Business: Sue Ponder, on behalf of the PCBA, requested for street closure of Main Street from Jefferson Street south to the alley for Trunk or Treat October 31, 2020, from 5:00-7:00 pm in conjunction with the EMS Spooktactular Supper. PCBA asked for placement of barricades by Public Works. Motion made by McDonald and seconded by Townsend. The motion was passed all ayes.

Scott DeVries, on behalf of the PCBA, addressed council about allowing local businesses to assemble lighted displays around Garden Square Park from December 12-25, 2020. There will be a need for use of electric services and inquiry was presented for the need for payment to rent the square and/or payment of electric used. A motion was made by Lindsey for no rental charge and use of electric for this event. The motion was seconded by Berger and passed all ayes.

Scott DeVries presented to council the request for \$60,000 toward the Downtown Revitalization Incentive Program for four addresses located on the square. It was moved by McDonald and seconded by Berger to provide the \$30,000 budgeted for this fiscal year to two of the addresses requested. The motion passed all ayes.

Brad Reiman with Northern Risk Partners presented the employee health insurance renewal options to council. Staff recommendation is to renew the current plan, Complete Blue 4000 HMO, on December 1, 2020. A motion was made by Taylor and seconded by Lindsay. The motion passed all ayes.

Jay with Blue Line Solutions presented council with information on the implementation of the new laser radar handheld and trailer options including the benefits of no cost implementation, reduced speed related accidents, and increased safety within community with a no contact option for officers. No action was taken by council. Contract review with the city attorney will progress resulting in a resolution for the November meeting.

The request was brought to council by Brad Magg, owner of Goldie's, to allow 15 minute parking on the north side of W. Second Street. W. Second Street is DOT's responsibility, but they have given the city authorization to allow parking if it is their wish. The city insurance carrier is comfortable with whatever the city decides to allow. The current ordinance states no parking is allowed on W. Second Street. No action was taken by council at this meeting, but the ordinance will be altered for this allowance and brought back to the November meeting for action.

Staff brought information back to council for demolition options of the former clothing closet building. Contractor cost would be approximately \$15,000 and for staff to do the work was within \$200 of contractor price. \$5,000 for water/sewer work, \$5,000 for dumpster rental/disposal, and \$5,000 to move electric to shed is the breakdown. It was moved by Lindsay and seconded by Berger to go ahead with relocating the electric services. Staff will investigate where additional funds to complete the demolition can be reallocated. Motion passed all ayes.

Councilor Taylor discussed citizen complaints she has received regarding road repair/maintenance. No major repairs/maintenance was budgeted or completed last fiscal year and citizens are expressing the need. This fiscal year \$80,000 was budgeted. A list has been compiled by public works, but council has asked for a map of these locations with rankings of repairs most needed to those that aren't quite as bad. Staff will construct the request as well as get in contact with contractors for chip seal pricing vs asphalt patching pricing and bring it back to November's meeting.

Lindsay moved to approve Resolution 10-14-20-4 setting the next Prairie City Council meeting for November 10, 2020, at the Community Building and via ZOOM at 6:00 p.m. The motion was seconded by Taylor. The Resolution passed all ayes.

<u>Public Hearings:</u> Mayor Alleger opened the Public Hearing at 9:00 p.m. regarding Ordinance 379 Fireworks. There were no spoken or written comments, for or against, proposed Ordinance 379. Mayor Alleger the closed the public hearing at 9:01 p.m.

It was moved by McDonald and seconded by Taylor to approve Ordinance 379 changing the language for the dates and times to shoot off fireworks and changing the fines associated with discharging fireworks

outside those dates and times. Ordinance 379 was approved with ayes.

Resolution 10-14-20-3 was approved by Taylor and seconded by McDonald waiving the second and third readings of Ordinance 379. The motion passed with Taylor, McDonald, Berger, and Lindsay voting aye, while Townsend opposed.

Lindsay moved to adjourn the council meeting and seconded by McDonald. The motion passed all ayes. The October 14, 2020, Prairie City Council meeting adjourned at 9:01 p.m.
