Prairie City Leadership:

Thank you for being a Waste Management customer. We value the partnership with the City and your residents. I was grateful for the opportunity to present in December our pricing and proposal for an extended Contract term. Based on the feedback and additional information I received then, and as per the invitation emailed to us thereafter to provide competitive bidding, I am following up with the below pricing proposal for your consideration.

You will note our total pricing provided is lower than our initial proposal. This is thanks to two factors - 1) The information provided by the City about the management and distribution of trash and yard waste carts, and 2) An error we identified in our yard waste collection pricing, were we incorrectly included the collection costs for 52 weeks of yard waste, rather than the limited yard waste season (about 36 weeks). Correcting this error reduced the rate significantly.

You will also note that the pricing has been broken up into service parts, so the City can choose if it wants to continue all its current services, or just parts, such as reducing the number of curbside cleanups. We provide these options for the City's benefit and consideration.

Proposed:

• A continuation of our respective services for a 3-year or 5-year term with service specific rates set as follows for Year 1:

Weekly Trash Collection (City provides carts)	\$10.63
Weekly One Bulk Item Collection (Cost per/home/month)	\$0.31
Weekly Yard Waste Collection (WM provides carts to City)	\$7.25
Spring Clean Up (Cost per clean up/home/month)	\$0.40

- In consideration of the City's budgeting cycle, we would agree to not implement these new rates until July 1, 2022. The anniversary date for annual rate adjustments would remain May 1.
- The City can choose between a fixed 3.5% annual increase, or the WS&T CPI for annual adjustments in pricing. If the City chooses the WS&T CPI, a floor of 2% would apply.

If you are agreeable to the continuation of any of these services, we can prepare a one-page Contract Extension document for your review that reflects whichever specifics above the City selects. All other terms and conditions of our current Contract would remain in place. Please contact me at ataylo23@wm.com or 515-229-3641 with any questions.

Midwest Sanitation & Recycling is seeking to be awarded the contract for the Collection of Solid Waste for the City of Prairie City. The cost per home, per month, would be \$17.00 for weekly trash service; this also includes Midwest Sanitation & Recycling paying the landfill fees.

Trash services required with all add on services, see below for add on services:

- Citywide Curbside Cleanup; \$0.50 per month (year-round charge) for one (1) yearly curbside cleanup
- Yard Waste; \$4.75 per month (year-round charge), serviced April through November and the first two (2) weeks in January for Christmas trees
- Recycling; \$4.00 per month (year-round charge) for every other week recycling services

The City of Prairie City will be responsible for billing residents through the existing water bill. The term of this bid is a five (5) year contract.

Year two (2) through year five (5) of the contract will have a yearly four (4) percent price increase on all services provided to the City of Prairie City.

Trash, Yard Waste, and Recycling will be provided in 95-gallon totes; the City will provide Trash totes and the Hauler will provide Recycling totes and Yard Waste containers.





Be It Enacted by the City Council of the City of Monroe, Iowa.

Chapter 92, Section 92.02 pertaining to water rates is amended by deleting 92.02 in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

92.02. RATES FOR SERVICE. Water service shall be furnished at the following monthly rates, and billed monthly, within the city:

1. Metered Water. Sales through meters installed on the premises shall be at the following rates:



Re: Bobcat UW56 Equipment Quote

Quote Number AMS-03995 was received from Capital City Equipment Company in Des Moines on December 21, 2021. Originally, the quote requested was for a used Toolcat. However, after discussion it was determined that the best option was for the City of Prairie City to purchase a new Toolcat with government bid. The used Toolcat had over 1,000 hours on it, had no warranty remaining, and was going to cost around \$35,000. The quote for the new Toolcat with government bid is \$47,031.80 and comes with twelve months of warranty on the machine plus an additional twelve for the engine. Since government bid is being utilized, there is not a difference in pricing if the machine is purchased from Capital City Equipment or Bobcat of Ames Dealership, government bid is the same across the board.

The Public Works Department is currently battling a hydraulic leak after it just returned from the shop to correct other issues. According to the equipment listing from 2019, our current Toolcat is listed as a 2005. I asked them to get three quotes but was informed that it won't be possible since we get government pricing from Bobcat – and we must stick with Bobcat brand, otherwise we will have to replace all the attachments that have been purchased for use with the piece of equipment.

The funding source to purchase the new Toolcat will be IPAIT Equipment Revolving. From the Parks Equipment Revolving account \$10,000 will be spent from the \$14,363.93 balance, and from the Sewer Equipment Revolving account \$37,031.80 will be spent from the \$43,940.95 balance.
